

Week 52 Daily Devotional

I. Prayer to enter the Lord's presence:

Be still for a moment. "Lord, I give the day that is now past to you. It is yours. I give the day that is to come to you; help me to see where you are working and to join you there. Speak to me during these moments. I commit them and myself to you."

II. Prayer of Confession:

"Lord, you are faithful to forgive me and cleanse me of my sin when I confess it to you. I confess my sin(s) of _____. Thank you for forgiveness." (1 John 1:9)

III. Prayer of Thanksgiving:

Choose to be thankful, speak out loud of what God has done.

"Thank you, Father, for _____. Fill my heart and my mouth with gratitude throughout this day."

IV. Scripture Reflection

Day 1**Read**

Teach us to number our days aright, that we may gain a heart of wisdom. Psalm 90:12

Reflect

Slow down, take a deep breath, turn your thoughts towards God. Think back over the past year. Take your time. Talk with God about the ups and the downs of the year. Talk with him about the things you did well, and the things you did poorly. Give him the year behind you. Leave it with him...good and bad, success and failure. Reflect on Psalm 90:12 and how remembering our days are numbered can lead to wisdom.

Day 2

Read

And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose. Romans 8:28

Reflect

This verse in its context gives confidence that nothing that happens to those who love God will be without ultimate purpose. We often look for “immediate reasons” for the various things that happen and become distressed or frustrated with that meaning eludes us. Meaning is there but it is not always immediately evident. All that God allows and brings into your life is tied to his ultimate purposes for your life in the gospel. Give the mysteries of this past year to God. Choose to trust God with the details knowing that the ultimate purposes of God have been made known in Christ. All that happens serves his purpose to make us more like Christ.

Day 3

Read

What does the worker gain from his toil? I have seen the burden God has laid on men. He has made everything beautiful in its time. He has also set eternity in the hearts of men; yet they cannot fathom what God has done from beginning to end. Ecc. 3:9-11

Reflect

Here the human dilemma, or “burden” is described. First, God has purpose in everything and he can see it clearly. Second, God has put a need for purpose inside us... “eternity in our hearts.” Third, we can’t fathom, or get our minds around all that God is up to. So, back to verse 9 “What does the worker gain from his toil?”, in other words, “What is the point?” Without the gospel lens...there is no point, it all appears to be pointless. However, we view all of life through the lens of what God has done in Christ Jesus. We don’t need to see everything made “beautiful” to believe that in fact it will be some day.

Respond

Your heart is hard-wired for eternity...for purpose. This purpose is God. All our searching for meaning is a search for God. God alone is eternal. What have you tried to derive meaning from this past year? How did it work? How did it fail to work? How did this search for meaning reveal your heart’s desire for God?

Day 4

Read

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.

2 Tim. 3:16,17

Reflect

Think of “teaching” as learning the good path. “Rebuking” is warning that you are veering off the path. “Correcting” is getting back on the path. “Training” is staying on the path. Life with God is a journey. We want to journey the good path. It is unnecessary to veer off the path into the ditches, we can, if we will...avail ourselves of God’s word in order to stay on God’s good path. We will not walk the path perfectly but we can do regular course correction...direction not perfection is the goal.

Respond

We need weekly, daily, and even minute by minute course correction. God has given you what you need to walk his path. His Word, His People (Church), and His Spirit. If you do not already have one, think and pray through a plan to utilize all of God’s resources to stay on course this year.

Day 5

Read/Reflect/Respond

This is our last devotional for 2019. Today we will read a very long chapter that focuses our attention on God's word. You don't see it in the English translation but in Hebrew each verse in each grouping of verses begins with the corresponding letter of the Hebrew alphabet. This was done to emphasize the importance of the details of God's words. Read this Psalm out loud if you can. Listen to yourself read and pay attention to all that God's word means to us. Thank God for giving us his word as you finish reading. Commit to obeying and treasuring his word in the year to come.

Isaiah 53:4-6
