## A deep suspicion of authority

God's authority is not <u>opposed</u> to our freedom but is the <u>source</u> of our freedom.

"Faith will totter if the authority of the divine Scriptures begins to waver." — Augustine

What is real? What is true?

Men and women thrive in the church when we both submit to God's authority and good design.

God's authority is the *source* of our freedom and flourishing.

<sup>11</sup> Let a woman learn quietly with all submissiveness. <sup>12</sup> I do not permit a woman to teach or to exercise authority over a man; rather, she is to remain quiet. 13 For Adam was formed first, then Eve; 14 and Adam was not deceived, but the woman was deceived and became a transgressor. <sup>15</sup> Yet she will be saved through childbearing—if they continue in faith and love and holiness, with self-control.

1 Timothy 2:11-15

**Complementarianism** is the view that men and women are equal in nature yet distinct in terms of their roles in the church and the home. The office of elder (pastor) is reserved for qualified men.

**Egalitarianism** is the view that women and men are equal in all respects... in their nature, in the offices of the church and in the home. The office of elder is open to both men and women.

**Complementarian:** universal command for male leadership

Egalitarian: culturally-specific command

Paul is <u>elevating</u> women in the life of the church.

First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, <sup>2</sup> for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way.

Paul, an apostle of Christ Jesus **by command of God** our Savior and of Christ Jesus our hope...

1 Timothy 1:1

<sup>17</sup> Obey your leaders and submit to them, for they are keeping watch over your souls, as those who will have to give an account. Let them do this with joy and not with groaning, for that would be of no advantage to you.

Hebrews 13:17

Both men and women are to submit to the authority of Christ.

Both men and women are to submit to the authority of the teaching elder.

Rooted in creation order

## Women are <u>essential</u> to the ministry of the church.

Paul's argument is grounded in creation order.

## Genesis <u>affirms</u> the equality of men and women

<sup>27</sup> So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them.

Genesis 1:27

Male authority must be characterized by Christlike love.

True masculinity mirrors the authority of Christ's love for his church.

How can women exercise their **gifts**, for the sake of building up the church in a way that honors and is faithful to the Bible?
